

FOUR DECADES OF LEADERSHIP IN AGING

We're celebrating the 40th anniversary of the Gerontology Institute at UMass Boston in 2024. The university's gerontology program is globally recognized for its expertise in policy, equity, financial security and other areas of focus.

We began with the Frank J. Manning Certificate program in 1979, followed five years later by the launch of the undergraduate program and the Gerontology Institute. In the late 1980s, the Gerontology Department and doctoral program were established and the *Journal of Aging & Social Policy* was founded. The Management of Aging Services program was added in 2003.

The Gerontology Institute has grown to include four unique centers: Pension Action Center (1994), Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (1999), Center for Social and Demographic Research on Aging (2012), and LeadingAge LTSS Center @UMass Boston (2017).
